

Partly because many of us do not like to wait. We grow impatient, which leads to irritability. This sense of irritability can allow so many unpleasant feelings to surface filling us up with emotions. Emotions that at times can lead us down paths that are very unpleasant to others and ourselves.

Advent traditionally is a season of waiting. Waiting on for the hope of the Christ child to appear. Waiting on the hope, forgiveness, and love that the Christ child will bring to us. Tech Update

In today's society, worship services are a mix of inperson services and virtual services which may better meet the needs of those who desire to worship outside the walls of a traditional church. While many of Pilgrim Faith's current members love to attend church in person where they can worship together, we acknowledge that many people may be looking for alternative ways to attend worship. Virtual services can be viewed at any time of day on any day of the week. Virtual worshippers may live in the neighborhood or many miles away. By offering virtual services both during and after the pandemic, Pilgrim Faith will be reaching out to a variety of potential new members who love and want to serve God with us.

Because of the stay at home order earlier this year, Pilgrim Faith was forced to find a way to offer a virtual service weekly with a minimal amount of preparation time. We greatly appreciate the efforts of Pastor James, Don Harris, Ken Langevin, Bob Cook, Peggy McGinnis, Aidan McGinnis, Mary Weierman, Keith Stevenson, Tom Aitken and Charles Martin who have devoted many hours to bringing live worship services to our members. As you may have noticed when viewing virtual worship services from Pilgrim Faith, we have often been faced with challenges in streaming those services smoothly. Those challenges in providing high quality video and audio streaming are caused by the age and structure of our building and the lack of adequate Internet infrastructure.

Due to those infrastructure inadequacies, the technology committee is currently seeking proposals from various venders who can provide installation of Internet and audio/visual capabilities throughout the building which will result in much better audio and visual streaming of our services. Improved internet speed and band width are vital to improving the quality of the live streamed worship services. Once all technology proposals are in, the technology committee will review them and pass them on to the trustees who will review them and make a recommendation to the church council which will recommend a proposal to the congregation.

At Pilgrim Faith UCC we welcome and embrace diverse lives, loves and spiritual journeys, so that everyone can participate in and feel and share the love of Jesus Christ and the Still Speaking God. A strong Internet presence will help us reach out to those who are unable to be with us physically in the sanctuary on Sunday.

Advent is Here

Central to our traditional Advent services is the lighting of the Advent wreath on Sunday and on Christmas day. Advent candles shine brightly in the midst of darkness, symbolizing and reminding us that Jesus came as Light into our dark world. The most common Advent candle tradition involves placing four candles around a wreath of evergreens with a white candle in the center. A new candle is lit on each of the four Sundays before Christmas with the white candle lit on Christmas.

To be an active part of each worship service during Advent, members are encouraged to create their own Advent wreath at home. To do so you will need to prepare five candles in advance (one white, one pink, and three blue or purple). As the Advent wreath is lit each week in the sanctuary, it is our hope that the members of each household will light the candles in their own Advent wreath as a prayer that Emmanuel's light and love will shine brightly in our hearts, spreading hope and peace to those around us.

Constitution Revisions

The committee working to revise the Pilgrim Faith UCC Constitution and Bylaws has been working tirelessly to bring the church Constitution (which was last revised in 1996) up-to-date. The Constitution committee began meeting weekly on Thursday evenings on October 22. Bob Cook is chairing the committee and keeping members focused on the weekly task at hand. As of November 19, the committee has completed Articles I-X of the Constitution which includes a modified vision statement and mission statement.

The committee's task for December is to tackle the revision of the church's bylaws as they pertain to staff, church officers, church council, boards, and committees. Hopefully, both the Constitution and Bylaws will be completely revised by early January so that they can be presented to the council and congregation by the time of the Annual Meeting.

Confirmation on December 13

In the fall of 2019 seven of our high school students from Pilgrim Faith began their journey toward confirmation. They participated in confirmation classes, completed written assignments, and worked with their mentors. Unfortunately, just as they were finishing up their last months of instruction, the pandemic hit, and it became impossible to hold an in-person service of confirmation in May. The confirmands were determined to be confirmed together publicly in front of the congregation, so the confirmation ceremony was postponed until the end of 2020. The confirmands are now scheduled to be confirmed on Sunday, December 13, 2020. With COVID cases increasing it is still impossible to hold a full in-person service that day, so the confirmation service will be virtual after all. All members of the congregation, however, are invited to witness the confirmation service virtually via Zoom or Facebook Live. This Christmas is the most unusual most of us can remember. It is a time for Great Joy, but many of



Project Heifer

"If I were a shepherd, I would give a lamb."

We sing the carols of Christmas that we love so well. Sometimes I hear just the beautiful melodies. Always they bring Peace. In the Bleak Mid-Winter has stirred me since I was a child. Nowhere in the Bible does it say that the shepherds gave Jesus lambs, just that they came and worshiped him. But a few of us ARE in a position to give a lamb \$120 and some of us are in the position to give a flock of chicks \$20 or a heifer (young female cow) \$500. We're city people, not country people. We don't know the value of these animals, but the "value" can be the difference between being able to feed a family or to watch them and listen to their cries of hunger. With the animals come a farm worker arrives, too, who teaches the community receiving the animals how to care for them. Chickens provide protein and some of the eggs, allowed to hatch produce more chickens, or eggs can be sold for a meager income. With each animal comes the promise to share the offspring: now two families are fed.

Because of Covid, it is not practical to dispense gift cards to you. Please make your own or a certificate telling the recipient you have made a gift in their honor. Best of all, call the recipient on Christmas and along with the gift in their honor, give them a gift of your time as you reach across the street or across the miles and connect your heart to theirs on Christmas.

The Christmas Fund

The Christmas Fund used to be Veterans of the Cross and gave help to the families of retired ministers in need and a small check at Christmas. It is no longer Veterans of the Cross because most retired ministers are receiving pensions. However, some minister's families have extraordinary expenses from time to time or on an ongoing basis. Extraordinary expenses may be included in having lost their homes in wildfires, or hurricanes or tornados. Ongoing may be having a handicap or dependent child with a handicap, that just can't be covered by the salary ministers are paid. Gifts to the Christmas Fund help with those expenses.

The Christmas Fund is also one of the **5 for 5 giving** opportunities offered by the wider church. The 5 are: Basic, ongoing support of the wider church.

One Great Hour of Sharing, tied to Easter and supporting world wide missions.

Strengthen the Church, tied to Pentecost, and supporting new church projects.

Neighbors in Need, tied to World Wide Communion Sunday and supporting mission within the US.

The Christmas Fund, tied to Christmas and helping the families of ministers with extraordinary needs.
