Dear Friends in Faith,

We have been engaged the 'sheltering in place', if possible, for almost 7 weeks with weeks still to go. This rather strange experience has played out different for all of us in unique ways and with different meaning. My thoughts and prayers are with each of you as I know all our daily routines have been altered in one way or another. We have never experienced anything like this before and, I personally, feel we are still on a steep learning curve of how our lives are being reshaped by this worldwide catastrophe.

The Church Council has asked me to communicate with the entire congregation the existence of our HOPE Fund. This is a fund that is available to members and friends of Pilgrim Faith who are in need financially during difficult times. Clearly, this is one of those times. I realize that you may, indeed, be in such a situation. I also know that most of us have this pride thing going and are hard pressed to ask for support, especially money, when it is needed to make ends meet. We want to assist you. This is how we can do so: 1) please contact me via phone or email (2) the distribution of money from the Hope Fund needs to be affirmed by several people, including the Moderator, Chuck Martin. Your request will be presented anonymously and, (3) on the person writing the check will know the identity of the recipient of funds. (4) All arrangements will be handled through me and will remain confidential.

Secondly, as we enter our third month of the pandemic, there are days when it seems easy to be on information overload. At times, the information appears contradictory. I am also aware, and I say this very carefully, that our sources of the news and information about the trajectory of this virus are varied and, in a few cases, offer vastly different perspectives one same situation. It is true that the steps of mitigation we have taken so far has been 'successful' in preventing the health/medical care system from becoming overwhelmed.

But this does not mean that the virus has gone away, in fact, the actual numbers of those infected continues to go up and may likely increase as we begin to 'reopen'.

We received yesterday, an outline of the stages from the Illinois Conference of the United Church of Christ which I have yet to fully study. They are closely aligned with those of the Governor. I will be sending this material to the Church Council to study as well as we slowly implement the process at and for Pilgrim Faith. My sense is that returning to worship in person in our sanctuary is still some weeks, if not months, away. May we all remain patient and hopeful for the long haul of coming out to the other side of this experience.

treasurer, applied for the program through the Oak Lawn Bank & Trust, which handled the application paperwork and portal management. countless of volunteers who staff shifts, provide food, clean up on Friday mornings, the students from area schools who set up each Thursday, who washed sheets, and the many individuals who donated toiletries, coats, and clothing throughout the season.

As you may know, all the BEDS Plus sites in the west and south suburbs were closed in mid-March due to the Coronavirus threat. BEDS Plus was able to consolidate all the sites by housing about 30 guests at St. Barbara's in Brookfield and by placing families and the employed homeless in motel rooms around the area. By moving quickly to protect BEDS guests, the program successfully kept the virus out of the shelters. At this point none of the BEDS guests have become ill with COVID-19. We pray that all remain in good health throughout the coming months.

Thanks to the generosity of many, we currently have no need for additional toiletries for next season. We will, however, need men's and women's jeans and sweatshirts next fall. So, if you are cleaning closets please wash those gently used jeans and sweatshirts, bag them, and hold onto them for us until September when we will once again be stocking the shelves!
