CHRISTMAS FUND For as long as anyone at Pilgrim Faith can remember, we have contributed to **The Christmas Fund/ Veterans of the Cross.** The Christmas Fund is one of the **4** Seasonal giving opportunities in which we band together with other UCC Congregations to make a difference, accomplishing more together than

we could as individual churches. Pilgrim Faith supports all four of the Seasonal Special Denominational offering opportunities.

The Christmas Fund for the Veterans of the Cross and the Emergency Fund is a Special Mission Offering that congregations have been supporting for over 100 years.

The offering is administered through the United Church Board for Ministerial Assistance, the charitable arm of the Pension Boards. Funds provide direct financial support to those who serve the church and are facing financial difficulties.

Active and retired clergy, lay employees, and their surviving spouses may be eligible for the Supplementation of Small Annuities, Supplementation of Health Premiums, Emergency Grants, and/or Christmas "Thank You" Gift Checks.

Friends,

As we enter the season of Thanksgiving and the beginning of Advent when we eagerly anticipate the celebration of Christ's birth, we find ourselves in turbulent times. 2020 has been a difficult year for all as we have faced the many challenges presented by a deadly pandemic, the loss of jobs, isolation from those we hold dear, and civil unrest within our country. For many this year has been one of the worst they have ever experienced, but through it all we have had our faith in God and our church community to sustain us.

In the United Church of Christ, we respond to life's challenges by embracing Three Great Loves: Love of Children, Love of Neighbors, and Love of Creation. Our actions reflect the scripture, "Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God: everyone who loves is born of God and knows God" (I John 4:7). MISSION BOARD & DISTRICT 123 NOVEMBER 8

For the first time ever, the Mission Board, in partnership with <u>School District 123</u> will be providing local children with Christmas gifts.

We need to tell the schools how many gifts we will provide and they need to have roughly the same value, of \$50 per child. You may provide for one child, more than one child or partner with other generous members for a gift.



Commitments can be made through November 8th. On November 9th

we will inform the contact person of the number of gifts we can supply. The school contact will then identify the neediest students in the district. The teachers will interview students and present a list of 3 things the student would like. No gift on the list will be more than \$50, but several smaller gifts may be on the list equaling \$50. The \$50 price is PRE-Sale. That is: The item may have a \$45 price/value, but you find it on Black Friday for \$19.95 YOU ONLY PURCHASE THAT ITEM, YOU DO NOT SPEND \$50. This is because more than one child in the family may have requested the item and you found it on sale, but someone else did not. We need gifts to be equitable for each child in the family.

On <u>November 15th</u> you will receive a list of 3 possible gifts, which you will shop for.

If, for any reason, doing the shopping is not practical for you, someone else will shop on your behalf.

You may donate any amount of cash to be combined with other smaller donations and gifts will be purchased on your behalf.

If you are making a cash donation, clearly mark it "Gift for a Child" and mail it to the church office.

If you are making a commitment to purchase for one or more children, PLEASE contact Diane Millar and leave a voicemail 708-508-5527 or email Diane at dianemillar17@outlook.com. Do Not call the office with your commitments.

After you have purchased your gift(s) bring them to church, <u>unwrapped before Dec. 15th</u> so the schools can distribute them before the December break. We can pick up the gifts from your home if you cannot bring them to the office during regular hours. Monday – Friday from 9:00 A.M.— 2:00P.M.

Help Feed the Homeless!

The BEDS Plus homeless shelter that is usually hosted by Pilgrim Faith each Thursday night from October 1 through April 30 is **not** operating in its usual way during the 2020-21 season. The BEDS guests are currently being housed in an alternative setting which is much safer for them during the on-going COVID-19 pandemic. **Despite the alternative setting, Pilgrim Faith has prepared, packaged and delivered approxi**

mately 580 meals to BEDS guests on Thursdays between June 4 to October 22!

We have been able to provide those meals because of the generous financial contribu-



tions which have been provided to Pilgrim Faith's BEDS Plus mission over the past few years. However, as Pilgrim Faith's food team continues to provide a meal for 60 guests at least once a month, the team needs additional monetary donations to off-set the cost of the meals which <u>cost at least \$200 each month</u>. If you can help the food team by providing a monetary donation, please send a check in any amount to the Pilgrim Faith office at 9411 S. 51st Avenue in Oak Lawn. Please make your check payable to *Pilgrim Faith UCC* and write *BEDS Meals* on the memo line of the check. **The South Suburban BEDS Plus guests really appreciate your on-going help!**

Since the BEDS Plus shelter **is not open** at Pilgrim Faith right now, **PLEASE DO NOT DROP OFF CLOTH-ING, COATS, SHOES, SOCKS, UNDERWEAR, OR PER-SONAL TOILETRIES AT PILGRIM FAITH.** We currently have an abundance of these items and will let you know when the shelter is in need anything else.
