As spring turns to summer, as the school year draws to a close, and our daily plans and activities anticipate sunshine, vacations, evening walks in the park, picnics and cookouts, the Church also finds itself in a new season, the season of Pentecost. This season is initiated by Jesus' final appearance to his disciples, when he says to them, "You are witnesses of these things. And see, I am sending upon you what my father promised, so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high." Luke 24:49

In this season, the Holy Spirit amazes us, astonishes us, and sends us out. It is a season in which we celebrate the birth of the Church and where the Body of Christ – you and me – are sent out to preach, teach, witness, and proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ. This is our season of justice and action, righteousness and advocacy, and speaking truth with passion and conviction. This is our time to be disciples sent for the purpose of making our world a place where justice, mercy and humility guide our every action.

We are witnesses to unjust, hateful, and dishonorable people who are making laws and policies that are hurting God's people and God's world. Lives are being shattered, hearts are being broken, our nation and all its goodness is being sold to the highest bidder, and we are living in a time when too many are giving lip service to what some call the golden rule only when it is expedient for their social, economic, or political agenda. This is not a time for the Church and people of the resurrection, inspired by God's Word, and empowered by the Holy Spirit to be timid, apathetic or complacent. Today, we, as

disciples of Jesus Christ are being called to speak truth to power, demonstrate sacrificial love in all that we do, and show the world that the Word of God is not for sale. We, "...have been clothed with power from on high..." If this is so, how then shall we live?

When we are clothed from on high, we see the world differently. When we are clothed from on high, we respond to God's people and God's world in faith, in justice, in mercy and with humility. When we are clothed from on high, we do what Senator Cory Booker challenges all Christians to do. We treat the world and its people with honor and respect, each with their own gifts and passions, and each made in the image of God. We show our faith in how we love the stranger, the alien, the foreigner, and how we advocate for God's beloved ones. We show God's love by providing services and programs for the weakest and the most vulnerable among us. And we remind ourselves that the measure of our success is not how much money, property, power, prestige we have, but how, instead, we choose to live and give. This is the Way of Christ and our way too.

On **Sunday**, **June 8**th, we celebrate Pentecost Sunday. In the morning, we invite you to wear red or rainbow colors and come to church, not to absorb, but to experience God's powerful words to be God's witnesses to all the world and to all its people. Come with an open heart and open minds, seeking God's direction for your action in the days, weeks, and months ahead. Ask yourself, where is God calling you? What is God calling you to be and to do? Prayerfully consider God's call. Then, join our evening service, "Witnessing Out Loud" as four UCC congregations meet in the spirit of Pentecost for prayers and action. We are witnesses, clothed from on high. This special service will take place at Pilgrim Faith UCC at 7 p.m. Now is the time to be faithful, passionate, and caring as we proclaim our story and live our Pentecostal faith.

Statement Correction – May Newsletter

The treasurer's report in the May church newsletter contained a section which I feel requires clarification and correction/ retraction. The section is:

March's numbers are still showing more expenses than income. Incoming 25,147 Expenses 27,504 Difference -2,357

Looking at the differences between them, we are trying to move small amounts from our savings to our checking. This practice has been happening for years by previous treasurers who did not make it public to the members. I refuse to sugarcoat what is currently happening with the church's money.

Essentially, these statements imply, directly and indirectly, previous treasurers were less than completely ethical while in office. By using questionable practices, by not being completely truthful in their reporting to the congregation about these practices, and by sugarcoating financial information, these previous treasurers had not fulfilled their fiscal responsibilities and obligations very well. As a result, the church members were not fully informed about the church's financial position.

Previous treasurers are not able to refute such a characterization of their tenures in office. They have all passed. However, I feel I can bring my perspective (as a past treasurer holding the office for some 13 years) to evaluating their body of work. Having known the treasurers for the last 40 + years, I know they did their very best in the job. Each treasurer set a high bar regarding timely, fact checked, accurate, and complete reporting to the congregation. When errors of commission or omission happened and they did occur, they acknowledged the problem and made all necessary corrections. Full disclosure – nothing unsaid or hidden. Totally diligent in and to their treasurer's work. Business transactions were honest.

legal and ethical. To my knowledge, there was never a question raised as to any of their actions or decisions. Nothing to see here.

The issue at hand is not one of "hurt feelings". I believe it is an issue of statements, unfortunately made, that are not factually correct. They infer an untrue characterization of the previous treasurers and their work. They cast aspersions that are unfounded. Long-term members who knew these treasurers know the truth. Younger members, not having the honor or pleasure of knowing and working with these men and women, are left with unanswered questions and unwarranted doubts. I think a retraction of these statements is in order. The previous treasurers are due nothing less. We owe them.

Summary of Council Meeting Minutes May 21st, 2025

Opening Prayer - Serenity Prayer

Open Session:

Old Business Items:

1. Approval of Council Minutes from April Meeting

Doreen made a motion to approve the minutes as written from April. Susan second. All in favor. The motion is approved.

2. Policy/Procedure Tracking

Will will address at the next Meeting: "Social Media/Church Communications" and "Safe Church and Building Use" policies

New Business Items:

- Liaison Updates:
 - Worship & Spiritual Life: Pastor Steve will be preaching on Sunday, May 25th. Kevin will be the liturgist.
 - Mission & Christian Education: All the monies have been sent out. A whole church clean out will be tentatively scheduled 7/18 at 8am-12pm.
 - Alyssa met with Advocate's Food Farmacy & Pastor Steve. Salem is planning to host the Food Farmacy every 2nd and 4th Tuesday.
 - Alyssa talked with Mary from the Food Pantry to understand their intention. If we merge with Salem, the pantry plans to move with us.
 - Alyssa will ask Ken for a list of things around the church that needs to be completed.
 - Buildings & Grounds: No updates.
 - Stewardship & Finances: A zoom meeting will be scheduled soon.

Building Usage/Leases

- There is a leaking toilet that needs a new gasket.
 - Doreen will ask Jack if he can replace the gasket.
- Air Conditioning Update-The council is in agreement to wait to purchase/fix the air conditioning pending the merger.
- Parsonage Walkthrough Update The walkthrough did not happen when planning, however, it will be rescheduled. Kevin will send the tenant a letter expressing our expectations (paying rent, late fees, need for repairs, etc.)
- Recycling: We are currently not recycling. Pastor Dan will Jook into our contract with Waste Management to see what they can offer.

- Mama Bear Salem UCC/Pilgrim Faith UCC Collaboration- Mama Bear is a film for the LGTBQ+ community. Following the film at Salem, Pastor Dan recommended a follow-up debrief session at PFUCC.
 - The cost of airing the film is a \$1,000 donation. Pastor Steven recommended \$500 from each church.
 Alyssa made a motion to approve \$500 for the viewing of Mama Bear in collaboration with Salem. Mary second. All in favor.
 Motion approved.
- Village of Oak Lawn- June 28th 4th of July Parade- Daune has been in touch with Salem to combine our efforts and presence.
- Finance Office Door Conversation- Doreen recommended Kevin reach out to the people that have not turned in their keys to the financial office before spending money to change the locks/keys.
- Worship Service YouTube Live Follow-Up- Mary has looked into this.
 Youtube is not an option because of the subscription fee. The council recommended a zoom link be included in the Mail Chimp that's sent on Friday with the bulletin as we are currently going through Zoom to log into Facebook.
- Treasurer Updates-
 - Mary will check with Amanda regarding the water bill. Is the church's bill fixed? Is our usage up/down
- Staff Relations Committee Evaluation Check-In- The committee is going to start with Pastor Dan then meet with the other employees (Alex, Zach, Curtis, Candace)
- Pastor's Report- Pastor Dan
 - Troop #652 Car Wash likely a Saturday in June
 - Bentley's Helping Hand is looking to rent Colonial Hall. <u>Council</u>
 was in agreement this would not work in the midst of a transition
 and recommended referring to Salem.
 - May 25th Absence: Steve will be <u>preaching</u> and Kevin will be the liturgist.
 - Resolution Document: Salem is voting on a merger with PFUCC on June 22nd. It has been recommended to share the resolution with Salem's council as written; Pastor Dan will share with Salem.
 - Organ Selling Follow-Up- Daune looked into selling the organ. Maybe we should look into bringing it to Salem if we merge. We should ask if Salem has someone who can play the organ. We can also ask Lisa & Ray S.
 - Sunday School Start-Up: Plan for Sunday school to start up in September.


