More Truth and Light

"Will you be faithful in preaching and teaching the gospel, in administering the sacraments and rites of the church and in exercising pastoral care and leader-ship?" [Portion of the Ordination Service, U.C.C. Book of Worship]

Yes, in the middle of summer, the celebration of our nation's Independence from Great Britain, family picnics, anticipated vacations, and a chance to slow down and enjoy less scheduled days, Pilgrim Faith United Church of Christ is gearing up for significant changes in our life together. Recently, the congregation received a letter that the Search Committee had completed their search and extended to me, a call to become the settled pastor of Pilgrim Faith U.C.C. On Sunday, July 17th, this call, by an affirmative vote of the congregation, will be formally extended to me to serve as your pastor. Upon an affirmative vote of the congregation, I will be installed as the next settled pastor sometime in the fall.

It has been a privilege to serve this congregation and I look forward to our continued ministry that will transition from a designated interim pastor to the settled pastor. As the congregation considers the recommendation of the Search Committee, it may be helpful to reflect upon Ordained Ministry. As part of the Ordination Service, vows are made by the candidate, the home congregation of the Ordinand, the Association, and the community. Ordination is a celebration of promises and commitments to serve God, provide spiritual support and care for Christians on the journey, and to lead the congregation in such a way that promotes, strengthens, and establishes the realm of God on earth as it is in heaven.

In congregations large and small, there is a desire, perhaps a tendency, for the congregation to see the pastor as Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the Church or the Chief Financial Officer (CFO). Most of us like other people to make big decisions, and

for many of us the corporate model is the most accessible model of how decisions are made. Frequently, congregations will default, or surrender their decision-making authority to the pastor. In none of our vows that we make on our Ordination Day, do we promise or assume the role of CEO or CFO for the congregation. Within our Congregational Polity, it is the congregation who makes these important decisions. There are several promises that we do make, but none is more substantial than the one I printed above. In summary: the pastor is faithful in preaching and teaching the gospel, administers the sacraments and rites of the church. and exercises pastoral care and leadership. This is a call to lead Christ's church with integrity, with grace, faithful preaching, and teaching, and to provide leadership in the care and nurture of God's people along every path of the pilgrim. These are the guiding principles in which I will lead. In every possible way, I will seek, facilitate, collaborate, encourage, or empower the laity to make important decision in our life together. As an Ordained pastor, I am the spiritual leader of the church, but am not called to be the CEO or CFO of Pilgrim Faith U.C.C.

Should I be affirmed to be your settled pastor, there will be important issues that we will need to face. together, with honesty, grace, and integrity. By God's grace, we will have this time to explore and collaborate on themes such as stewardship, church growth, Christian nurture, and our invitation to create a just world for all. The role of the pastor is not to make decisions on behalf of the congregation, but to facilitate our life in such a way that, together, we discern the answers. What will be important is how well we work together, how we treat one another, and how we demonstrate God's love and grace in all that we do. It is this that will bring God's realm of peace and justice for all. With joy and anticipation, I surrender my candidacy to the will of the congregation and may we, together, be the vision and energy that brings the Spirit of Pentecost to this place.

But to what point? We come to the center of knowledge? To the point that we lose our sense of wonder. Are you able to see beyond your own sight or beliefs?

Some people are trapped in their own sight and knowledge of the world. We saw that with Roe vs Wade. They will twist the truth to fit their wants and needs. In doing this God is now less than a comma. God's name is center but not God's will. The needs of the many will outweigh the needs of the few or the one. Removing rights does not equal freedom.

Remember the story of Adam and Eve? If God did not want us to have free will, God would have removed the tree totally or restart the human race over, over and over again until Adam and Eve did not eat the apple. God did not do that. He wants us to pray, reflect and then move.

So now what do we do? Do we still fight the good fight? Most people will continue to house, help and protect the rights of others. We need to have our eyes open to what God is calling us to do. How do we do that? We pray. God will make the path clear. We will have insight that only comes from God. Don't rely on ourselves or our collective knowledge; instead, pray. God will show us the way.

The End of the Year Picnic was a lot of fun! Seven youth and six adults enjoyed yard games, good




Book Club Summer Break


