More Truth and Light

"This is what you heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

-Acts 1:4b-5

"...Not many days from now..." is a reference to the Festival of Pentecost that Jesus shared with his disciples just before he ascended to God. The Day of Pentecost marks an important point in the life of the Christian Church. It is that season when the Holy Spirit makes its debut into the Christian faith. The rush of a mighty wind. Divided tongues, as of fire, and all were filled with the Holy Spirit. It is the Holy Spirit that bridges the chasm of time, brings people and nations together, imagines and re-imagines great and mighty ways in which the work of ministry and mission can happen. The Spirit has inspired and continues to inspire Christians throughout the generations to see God's good work, love, and grace in new ways. It is the Holy Spirit that brings us faith and meaning today.

As we approach the Day of Pentecost and enter this season of the Holy Spirit, I would invite you to reflect with me on the ways in which the Holy Spirit has blessed our congregation and where the Holy Spirit is challenging us in these days. Certainly, my thoughts are not the only blessings we have known or the challenges that are before us. I would invite you to add your list of blessings and challenges, offer them to God in prayer and find your own way to respond to the tug of the Holy Spirit.

Perhaps the most dramatic change has been the improvement of the morale of our congregation and the joy of seeing more people in worship and seeing some whom we have not seen in a while. The Holy Spirit brings us healing and encouragement. Throughout this year, we have been transitioning to a smaller and more effective way to govern and lead our congregation. We have hired musicians for worship, an Office Administrator to take care of the day to day and week to week activities, and we've introduced a new concept of ministry and church leadership. The Holy Spirit brings the necessary changes to be a more effective congregation. In the past year, we have brought together youth and four Confirmands to continue their faith journey through the programs we offer. Messy Church has given us an opportunity to learn, worship, and fellowship together. The Holy Spirit gives us food for the

journey of faith that calls multiple generations into a season of change.

Just as the Holy Spirit blesses us with abundant gifts, the Holy Spirit also challenges us to engage in a deeper, more committed response to discipleship. I believe that the Holy Spirit has revealed three challenges that we need address in the coming weeks and months - energy, letting go, and innovation. We have fewer members and many of us are doing multiple things and the level of activity has taken its toll upon us. In many ways Pilgrim Faith is beginning again. Launching a new church takes energy and work that requires time, talents, and treasures. I do believe that God still has a future for us, and we must find ways to nurture our spirits and give us the strength to do the work God is calling us to do. In addition, we also need to 'let go' of the way we've done ministry before and adapt to a still, viable ministry with fewer people and fewer resources. The Holy Spirit is giving us an opportunity to let go of what we've done and embrace new ministries, new programs, and new experiences that reflect our ministry today. The final challenge follows this notion of 'letting go' and that is to allow ourselves to be innovative and creative with new ministries. We need to embrace our progressive vision and our Open and Affirming statement and create programs and ministries that reflect the open and inclusive community we believe we are called to be in this new time.

In this season of Pentecost, this time that is less demanding, a break from the program year, we have time to explore, study, pray, adapt, and prepare for a new time for Pilgrim Faith U.C.C. Yes, the Lord has 'more truth and light' to share with our congregation. Use this season to remember where we have been and listen for God's New Word that is being revealed to us.





A NOTE FROM OUR TREASURER

Good News

We have received notification from our bank that the "loan" we received under the Payroll Protection Plan 2 program offered by the federal government has been forgiven. None of the \$27,460 we were given through the program has to be repaid. Through both PPP1 and PPP2 programs combined, Pilgrim Faith has been given a total of \$54,920, none of which had to be returned. We are thankful.

Another item of note – the auditors are coming to Pilgrim Faith Thursday and Friday- June 1 and 2. The on-site work should be completed in those two days. However, if an item of question does arise, the work may continue into the following week. Part of the audit is a testing of the accuracy of year end statements sent to members. Only a sample of donors will be contacted. Those selected will receive a letter in the mail with instructions. Please follow them as timely as you can. The audit cannot be completed until the auditor receives all the information he needs. Pilgrim will receive a report once the auditor finishes his work. The church has not had an audit for many years. We look forward to the results to improve our operations and reporting
