More Truth and Light

"I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth; do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert."

-Isaiah 43:20

In times of transition, these words from the prophet Isaiah bring hope and comfort. When we read the prophet's words, we can imagine God speaking, ".... I am about to do a new thing...do you not perceive it?" As the gospel of John reflects, 'the Holy Spirit blows where it wills' and God is continuing to breathe new life and new direction in a people who live and rehearses the stories of God's continuing grace, God's cry for peace and justice, and God's inclusive love that seeks in whatever way possible, to live and dwell with us. Even still when the Holy Spirit breathes, change happens and change for most of us is uncomfortable. How comforting and beautiful it is when in the same breath where 'new things spring forth', the prophet reminds us that even so, God will make a way in the wilderness and God will spring forth rivers in the desert. Change is happening and the good news is that no matter the change, it will be alright because God knows our struggle in accepting the newness of change.

Pilgrim Faith has completed several important conversations and an important assessment about our life together and what 'new thing' is springing forth. For several years, our membership has been declining and we no longer reflect the demographics of Oak Lawn. The energy level of our membership is concerning, and although our facilities are in good shape, it is too big of a building for us to do the kind of ministry we are currently doing. Our giving, in comparison to the national average, is low. The national average monthly giving per giving unit is around \$2262.00 compared to our monthly giving which is around \$1100.00 per giving unit. The question that Thrive and the Church Council have been trying to answer is what is a

sustainable ministry for us today? Through conversations and analysis, Thrive and the Council have summarized four possible options for Pilgrim Faith United Church of Christ. They are a possible merger, shared/ yoked ministry, sell the building and move to a smaller location, and to remain in the same space with an adjustment in mission, and pastoral leadership. The congregation will be invited to reflect upon the options, and at a future Congregational Meeting, we will decide what kind of ministry is reasonable and sustainable for our church today. At the annual meeting, you received a packet that included the four possible scenarios, the results of our quick assessment, and an analysis of each of the four options that articulate the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats (SWOT) of each of the four options.

In preparation for a congregational vote, there are three listening sessions that have been scheduled by the Council to provide a forum by which members and friends of Pilgrim Faith UCC can ask questions, seek clarifications, and continue to discern where the Holy Spirit is calling our Church in the future. The dates for the three listening sessions can be found in a separate article within this month's newsletter. Yes, God is calling us to make important changes and no matter the choice we make, God will see us through. "Behold, I am about to do a new thing! Do you not perceive it?" Yes, God will be there to show you through the wilderness and all will be well, it will be very well.

Approval of Council Minutes from December Meeting

Ken made a motion to approve the minutes as written from the December council meeting. Tom second. All in favor.

Financial Report –

End of year review of finances

The rentals that Ken brought in this year really helped cut our deficit.

There is still work to do with converting the finances to the bookkeeper. The current finance team will complete January's reports. Tom made a motion we consolidate the memorial funds (aside from Grace Pluhar and Mary Gates) to the undesignated memorial fund to be used as council and/or the congregation see fit. Ken second. All in favor. Motion passed.

The Pluhar family wished the memorial funds go to the Food Pantry. Ken suggested it be split between the pantry and the youth groups. This will show on the January report.

Right now, we are not changing the process of using the gold sheets. Keith (bookkeeper) will let us when/how things change by next week.

Review the 2024 budget

Thinking about moving forward, it will be important to prioritize what couple of things really matter to our church. Daune suggested maybe consolidating funds that are not utilized (cookie fund for example) to use in ways that are meaningful for our current goals/missions.

28 pledges totaled about \$70,000, \$81,00 was figured out by including those who do not pledge but

Revenue has been up to ~\$163,000 putting into account Acorn to Oak, parking passes, and the parsonage.

3% salary increase - \$123,750

The music budget was a little over budget last year so they have been given more money for 2024.

Tom is recommending the individual ministry teams keep their own budget to cross check.

Proposed deficit = \sim \$80,000

Tom is recommending we keep ACS in place until March when we are confident in the system that is in place. (\$142/month includes ACS and Realm)





Fundraiser for Lahaina, Hawaii

The devastating fires that occurred on August 8, 2023 on the island of Maui (particularly the heavy-hit Lahaina area) have left many people without shelter, food, or any of their belongings. But they feel blessed to have lived through this horrendous experience. It is with the help of the UCC Disaster Ministries that the Hawaiian people are beginning to find a way forward. The Disaster Ministries is there to offer long-term assistance where it is needed most. They partner with dozens of organizations, large and small, for holistic, community-based recovery. According to the Hawai'i Conference UCC, it is expected to be 1.5 - 2 years before rebuilding can begin, and with the damage in Lahaina, they anticipate it will be a 7 to 10 year rebuilding process. We offered the Pilgrim Faith family a chance to help through the **January Coffee Hour of Giving**. Each week there were Hawaiian-themed treats for Coffee Hour and some Hawaiian décor to get you in the spirit of giving!

Transitioning to a New Bookkeeping Service

Taking care of the business side of the church can, at times, seem like having full-time jobs for our faithful volunteers. Pilgrim Faith has been blessed with many people who have guided us with managing church funds over the years. Most recently, we have had Tom Aitken, Roger Dykstra, Pat Stancik, Amanda Sullivan, and Chris Raap, along with our counters Libby Langevin and Kay Gibson diligently working behind the scenes taking care of the day-to-day business of our finances. To these dedicated people, we give our heartfelt thanks! With the number of hours that were being spent on managing our church finances, it would likely be challenging to find volunteers who are willing/able to continue with doing all the work. The Council therefore voted to move to a bookkeeping service. We received two quotes from companies that work with churches. We opted to hire the Church Training Center to take care of our bookkeeping needs starting February 1, 2024. They are a company in California who have been working with The UCC Illinois Conference to help them organize their finances. Keith Clark-Hoyos founded this company to empower churches to thrive and make a meaningful impact within their communities. He does this through training and coaching church leaders. I was fortunate enough to participate in Church Governance Cohort with Keith last Fall and found him to be approachable, dedicated, and very knowledgeable. With the guidance of the Church Training Center, I believe that we can put our focus back on mission and what God is calling us to do. Keith has also offered an invitation to our Treasurer (free of charge) to participate in his Mastery Coaching Group for Church Treasurers. We look forward to working with the Church Training Center, to have our and make a meaningful impact within their communities.
