More Truth and Light

"And you beneath life's crushing load, whose forms are bending low, who toil along the climbing way, with painful steps and slow..." Poem by Edward Sears

This words from the poem written by Edward Sears (Circa, 1849), was put into a beloved carol that we know as "It Came upon the Midnight Clear." It is perhaps my most favorite Christmas carol. I love the imagery, the contrast between light and darkness and common experiences of men, women, and children throughout the generations. When I sing this carol, I feel as though I know the people whose 'forms are bending low' and those 'toiling along the climbing way.' Recently, I was out shopping with Carly, and I watched the people, I looked at their faces, and I said first in my mind and then aloud, 'My goodness, the people I'm seeing look so tired, so weary.' I could very well have projected my own state of being when I shared my observations with Carly, or I was sensing what people in the United States are experiencing in these days. In such a time as this, 'how does a weary world rejoice?' This Advent theme reflects so perfectly what I am feeling these days and what Sears wrote about when he wrote his beloved poem. As a people, as a nation, as a church and the world, we've experienced much that has made us tired, cynical, perhaps very sad. The fast pace of communication, the feeling of helplessness amid multiple crises that threaten our climate, our people, and our fragile democracy. Given all that we know is happening in our time, we are tired, we are weary. In the northern hemisphere, our weariness is multiplied by the cold days and short nights. Amid all of this, we want to be strong for our children, for the generations behind us and even then, our efforts bring us down and we ask, 'how does a weary world rejoice?'

Throughout this season of Advent, we will explore answers to this question. Acknowledging our weariness is a first step in finding the healing of this season. As another beloved carol proclaims, '...*The*

hopes and fears of all the years are met in you tonight..." Once we know our fears, we can look for the hope that helps a weary world rejoice. The words from the carol, Angels from the Realms of Glory remind us that we find joy in a weary world by connecting with the world and its people who have demonstrated time and again, God's abiding presence. The lyricist writes, *"Saints before the altar bending, watching long in hope"* and fear, suddenly, your prayers attending Christ beside you shall appear." A weary world rejoices when we allow ourselves to wonder and to be amazed at the unexpected ways that God's Spirit breaks into our world and helps us embrace the forever presence of God in our lives. In the Epiphany Carol, "We Three Kings" we are invited into a world of wonder and amazement. "O star of wonder, star of night, star with royal beauty bright, westward leading, still proceeding, guide us to thy perfect light." The weary world rejoices when we can allow ourselves to be amazed. How does a weary world rejoice? We rejoice when we acknowledge our weariness, find strength in our connection with one another, and allow our minds and spirits to be amazed. In doing these things, the stories of hope that enshrined in the Christmas story bring us joy and meaning on Christmas morning. With confidence and great joy, we sing, "Joy to the earth! The Savior reigns! Let all their songs employ; while fields and floods, rocks, hills, and plains repeat the sounding joy" and our weary spirits rejoice.

How does a weary world rejoice? We rejoice when we can *'rest beside the weary road, and hear the angels sing.* 'In this season of Advent may we find time to do just that – pause and hear the angels sing. This is how a weary world rejoices. May your Advent be filled with quiet moments of joy!

To hope is not to wait around until you are feeling optimistic, but to join with others in defiant response to what we are doing to the planet. It is an action that you do rather than a feeling that you have. "Hope is a verb with its sleeves rolled up," David Orr, a leading environmental thinker.

Bright Spot 1

"Project Drawdown" is a global research organization that identifies, reviews, and analyzes the most effective solutions to climate change. It ranks "reducing food waste" as the third most important step to tackle climate change, out of a list of eighty solutions. Recovering just 25 percent of wasted food could effectively end world hunger.22

Bright Spot 2

The Finnish supermarket chain S-Market hosts a "happy hour"—reducing food prices by up to 60 percent an hour before closing for items close to their expiration date. After the store closes, the remaining discounted products are donated to more than eighty charities, and any inedible leftovers are converted into biofuel. Danish

Bright Spot 3

Italy provides tax breaks to supermarkets that donate unsold food.

The Danish supermarket Wefood goes even further: its entire stock comprises waste-food items, which it sells at greatly reduced prices. *What can Pilgrim Faith do to spread hope?*

DELEGATE'S REPORT Repentance, Rekindling, Renewal

It has been my pleasure as your delegate to the wider church to attend two important meetings in the last few weeks. On September 30th, the Chicago Metropolitan Association has it's fall meeting at Northfield Community Church. It was wonderful to be back in person after Zoom meetings for 3 years. Molly Carlson, our Conference Minister, was there. She spoke about building trust among the churches, the associations and the conference. I thought she gave a good talk about how these groups sometimes don't trust each other and she seems determined to work towards a more faithful conference.

The Illinois Conference Annual meeting was Nov. 3rd and 4th. The first day, started early afternoon and we had our choices of workshops. I attended 3 and found them all interesting and valuable.

On Saturday we had the business portion of the meeting. After the usual approval of minutes, the meeting moved on to the report from Jon Prain, Conference President. His main message was talking about rebuilding trust within the conference.

The biggest issue at the conference was the financial report. When Molly Carlson started as Conference Minister in 2020, the finances in the conference were a mess. The former bookkeeper retired and Molly brought some experts in church finance and that team with the new Illinois Conference bookkeeper and the Finance and Business committee, have done a great job in untangling where the money is and should be. Now that the finances are looking better, Molly is concentrating on rebuilding trust and working together. The item that is of most interest to me, is a proposal that the camps become their own 501c3 organizations. This will take a few years to decide on the proposal and, if approved, to implement the changes.

All in all, this was a great 2 days spent with wonderful old friends and new, all working to improve the Illinois Conference.
