August Moderator's Article

Hi everyone! As I write this letter, I get torn in writing it, and I will tell you why. In Council, I shared with the team that I don't like writing things to complete a task, but to help you all feel informed, up to date on what's happening, and making sure any questions/concerns are being addressed. As a Council, and even our Transition Team too, we are doing our best to make sure we're moving forward, as well as giving space to feel all of the feelings we are feeling from all of the time we have spent at Pilgrim Faith, whether a few weeks to a whole lifetime. You are all incredible people who have dedicated time, talents, and tithes into this special place, and that makes me happy to look at and to marvel at the dedication you have given to this remarkable place.

As we move forward, we also want to let you know what we've done, and where we are going:

- We have secured legal counsel- **Ken Friker** and are finalizing some details needed to start the legal process with Salem and Pilgrim Faith to make the new church.
- We have secured real estate agents to help us with the sale of the property- John Kmeicik and Bill Erdman- we have started taking pictures and the process of this- more on this to come soon!
- We are planning to worship the third Sunday of every month at Salem UCC starting in September
- We met with the combined transition team (both Pilgrim Faith and Salem combined) and we
 will be finalizing mission/vision statements, as well as names for consideration to be presented
 at a joint congregational meeting. Anticipate this happening in October/November
- We have tasked some individuals to investigate some options for a legacy, as this concern has been brought up by some. We are hoping for recommendations for this to be shared with the Council/Transition Team by **September 25th** (the deadline we gave them). Recommendations for this will also be brought forth to a congregational meeting.
- Next, I wish to let you know that the Council/Transition Team is working with a tentative start
 date at the new church (which is located at 9717 S Kostner Ave Oak Lawn, IL 60453) on January 1st, 2026. We realize not everything will be done, but our teams will figure out what will still
 need to be done at the new church and prioritize that.
- Finally, I wish to stress any concerns/thoughts/feedback needs to be brought to the Council/ Transition Team, as they are the individuals actively working on this merger and are the best source of information. You can always talk to me as well!

Thank you for everything you all do, from showing up for worship, to ministry team meetings, youth events, music/worship, mission work, building work, helping with building partners, finance team, and so much more. No matter what you do, thank you for being YOU! We couldn't do it without you, and we are here for you if you ever need anything.
