More Truth and Light

"He himself granted that some are apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors, and teachers to equip the saints for the work of the ministry, for building up the Body of Christ." Ephesians 4:11-12

As I reflect on our life together, I am reminded of two significant events in our life together that, I believe, demonstrates, and illustrates what it means to 'equip the saints for the work of ministry' that was written by the Apostle Paul in the first Century. What I am remembering is the installation and commissioning of Kurt Kalas as our Volunteer Lay Minister of Visitation and the beginning of five important conversations that we are having around this notion of what we are doing and/or can do to 'build up the Body of Christ.'

In this edition of *More Truth and Light*, I also want to recognize all the volunteers at Pilgrim Faith United Church of Christ who work tirelessly and faithfully on behalf of a congregation to build up the body of Christ. There are volunteers serving this congregation from the food pantry to Sunday morning worship and everything in between. There are kids and adults ringing bells and singing in the choir. We have several nursery attendants, liturgists, ushers, sound, and video technicians and volunteers who plan food and hospitality on Sunday morning. There are several ministry teams, interest groups, and quiet card senders who remember our sick and homebound. All of these and many more make it possible to be a witness to our faith community that we dearly love. Truly, in the spirit of Paul's letter to the church in Ephesus, we are equipping the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the Body of Christ. Without each and everyone of these faithful people, we could not do what Jesus called us to do, to share God's love from 'Jerusalem to the ends of the earth.' Most who are active in the life and ministry of Pilgrim Faith U.C.C. know who our volunteers are and continue to be and I would encourage each of you to express your gratitude to the 'saints' working diligently and faithfully to be a congregation that truly seeks to make a difference in the world

and the lives of others.

The Protestant reformer, Martin Luther, believed in the 'priesthood of all believers.' In light of the phenomenal control of the priesthood in the sixteenth century, Luther's use of 'priesthood' was significant, risky, and a powerful statement that changed the course of history, especially in reference to the role of clergy and laity within the church. Luther dismissed the elitism and the power center of the Catholic and Orthodox priests. His statement removes the role of the priest as intercessor for the sins of humanity and put this authority in the hands of the laity, setting up a dynamic that would continue to disempower the clergy and empower the laity to do the good work of building up the Body of Christ.

important conversations that we are having around When we, as a Congregational Church, commission lay leaders, discuss the future of our ministry, and call special congregational meetings to make important decisions about our life together, we are demonstrating the meaning of 'the priesthood of all believers' and acknowledge that the laity, and not the clergy, are responsible for our destiny. In expressing our gratitude to our volunteers, installing and commissioning Kurt Kalas for the Lay Minster of Visitation, and our ongoing World Café conversations, we are celebrating the laity and all that they do to build up the Body of Christ. Yes, even as we have important conversations about our future, we continue to be the Church that is making a difference. Thank you volunteers and faithful members of Pilgrim Faith U.C.C. who are the 'apostles, evangelists, pastors, and teachers' who are bearers of more truth and light every day.

RESULTS OF THE CONGREGA-TIONAL MEETING 6/11/2023



Thanks to all who attended and shared your thoughts on June 11, 2023 as we considered whether to proceed with the investigation into Independent Senior Housing. It was a blessing to hear both the voices that were in favor of continuing the process and those who do not think it is the right path for us. I respect all your thoughts and hope that you will continue to be engaged in the process.

After all questions and ideas were shared, we took a vote.

This is what the ballot stated:

After thoughtful, prayerful, and careful consideration, the Council moves that we contract with Pandion to complete the evaluation of the senior housing proposal that will be paid for with the funds from the Fletcher and Delves bequests.

Yes - 24 No - 11

The majority has voted to move forward with the next phase of the project.

Please remember, this is NOT the final decision, it is a vote to have Pandion Management Services, continue the research study into this project. They will review the original RFP (Request for Proposal) that was prepared by the Pilgrim Faith team, make any necessary changes, including a plan on how we can move forward, and present us with their findings by the end of summer. The cost for these services is \$12,000, which is a large amount of money, but the congregational affirmative vote represents our commitment to investigating a project that could bring much to our church and to the community.

JUSTICE AND PIZZA

We had a productive gathering at the home of Daune & Ken Sebastian on Sunday, June 4th as we viewed and discussed together the documentary, "Who we are: A Chronicle of Racism in America." Following the viewing we had a lively discussion with wonderful food. Thank you, Daune, and Ken, for your hospitality and providing space and a light dinner for us. Out of the event, we've decided to rejoin Community Renewal Society, a justice ministry begun by the United Church of Christ and is in the city of Chicago.

Through the network of the Community Renewal Society, some of us participated in a conversation with the Chicago Police Department around Gender Based Violence and the kind of networking and training that could assist the officers responding to Gender Based violence. In addition, we will be able to participate in the monthly volunteer meetings of the Community Renewal Society that will provide opportunities for us to advocate and respond to issues of justice in our communities, the State of Illinois, and the Federal Government.

In the Fall the Justice and Pizza group will plan an opportunity for others to view and discuss the documentary, "Who we are: A Chronicle of Racism in America". In addition, we will invite participants to take the Harvard Implicit Association Test (HIAT), around issues of race. We will continue to seek out and invite others to participate as advocates for justice in our communities. Stay tuned for more details on this event.

The film captures the experiences and challenges of Black women, their families, caretakers and advocates around the injustice and disparate rates of mortality around black women and childbirth. Advocate Health Care and several other organizations are sponsoring this informative event.


