"O God, my God, known to me in the Jesus Christ, I give myself to you as your own to love and serve you faithfully all the days of my life. Amen."

Prayer of the Candidates for Confirmation

As a child who was baptized in infancy approaches adolescence, the local church offers our young people the opportunity to give public assent to the baptismal promises their parents made for them on the day they were baptized. Now, the Confirmands take upon themselves the promises of their baptism. Confirmation celebrates this occasion of affirmation of baptism in the life of the Confirmand, and the local church. For over a year, we have been meeting with several of our young people, and we're excited to be able to celebrate their decision to affirm their baptismal vows and to make a public commitment of membership to Pilgrim Faith UCC. On Sunday, November 27th, the Rite of Confirmation will happen during our morning worship. This will be an exciting and awesome day for our church, and the Church of Jesus Christ.

Although Confirmation is not something that we find in scripture, there are several passages that seem to indicate a time of learning and discernment of God's presence in a young person's life. I am remembering the story of Samuel. Samuel had been left at the Temple at a young age by his mother Hannah, who could not conceive a child and made a promise to God that if God blessed her with a child, at an appropriate age, she would dedicate him to the Temple to learn about God from the priests and rabbis. This happened. Hannah dedicated Samuel to the Temple, and he hears the voice of God. While sleeping Samuel heard his name called three times. Thinking it was Eli, the priest, he approached Eli and said, "Here I am, for you called me." It took two times, but Eli realized that the voice Samuel was hearing was the Lord's voice and he said to Samuel, "Go lie down; and if the voice calls you again, you will say, 'Speak, Lord, for you servant is listening."" He heard the voice and responded, and Samuel grew in wisdom and stature and became a leading prophet in a time when 'the word of the Lord was rare.' Samuel confirmed his call and promised to be a faithful prophet of the Lord.

In the New Testament, we are aware of a similar story

with the young Jesus. We learn that each year his parents went to Jerusalem to participate in the festival of the Passover. When Jesus was twelve, he joined his parents to celebrate the Passover. When his parents left Jerusalem to return to Nazareth, Jesus stayed behind. For three days Mary and Joseph were looking for Jesus and when they returned to Jerusalem, they found him *'sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking questions.'* Mary was furious with Jesus and asked why he treated them in such a dishonorable way. Jesus said to his parents, *"Why were you searching for me? Did you not know that I must be in my father's house?"* Jesus learned about his faith and confirmed his call and made a commitment to teach about God's love and grace.

So, for the Confirmand, this has been a time of learning, discerning, and listening for the voice of God along their own journey of faith. Now they come before us to make their promise to '**love and serve God faithfully all the days of their lives.'** The Rite of Confirmation is an important time for us as the Church, and for the Confirmands who are making their promises. As we witness again the promises made by our young people, may we also remember our own baptism, our Confirmation promises, and recommit ourselves to '**love and serve God faithfully.'** May this be our prayer in this month of November – a month of gratitude, the beginning of our Advent journey, and the commitment of our life to God, made known to us in Jesus Christ.

You don't need to know the history of the Bible to give witness to the works of God. People feel that they are not worthy to talk about how God walks with them during times of trouble or need.

In the past, people did things that were troublesome; if we keep that motivation as we move forward, the church will not grow. Nothing grows in fear, but paranoia and hurt. We need to start letting go of the past and focus on the future.

You don't need to feel that if you step away everything will collapse. I promise it will not. It will grow in the way God wants it to grow.

If we look at accounts received and accounts payable - yes it looks like we are in trouble, but we are overlooking the truth. We can either give 3 years of trying to grow (in whatever way God is calling us) or we can look at closing Pilgrim Faith while praising God for the years that Pilgrim Faith has been active. Or we can continue to foster fear, bullying and manipulation from a few. Holding the way of the past will not allow us to see what God has in store.

We place our lights on in our house to have light throughout the room. We don't place our lights into the closet and close the door.

Let your light shine at Pilgrim Faith. If God is calling you to be part of the solution, do not let anyone stop you. For what God is moving you to do no one will stop you.
