More Truth and Light

The holly and the jolly are put away. The Christmas past gave us special memories, a lot of laughter and a feeling – for a time – that all seemed 'right' with the world. The warmth of family and friends kept our spirits high, hopeful, and filled with joy. Now, as we stand on the threshold of the New Year, it feels less joyous, less hopeful, and there is a lot of uncertainty in our world today. We don't know what to expect. Even in our life together, we feel the heavy burden of a smaller congregation, less money, and fewer programs than we once knew. Certainly, this year does give us pause, and probably more than any other time in our life together, we could use a little divine intervention. However, I do believe that God created us as cocreators with God and that together, we can make a difference. What we need is the faith to believe that we can. How then should we embrace this New Year – one day at a time.

I have a friend who has been running for a long time and he would frequently post his runs for the day. He was more of a cross-country runner than a track and field or treadmill runner. I remember seeing that he had run 10 miles and I had commented on his Facebook page that I wanted to be able to do that too. Not long after my comment he responded – one mile at a time. I think that is good advice – one mile at a time. I'm still running one mile at a time, and I haven't reached 10 miles, but I'm still running. I think his comment is one to reflect upon at the beginning of this New Year. As Lao Tzu once said, "the journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step." No, we don't know what the year holds. Yes, we can speculate, and we may even have a pretty good hunch, but we cannot let the big picture overwhelm us. Instead, we take each day with a little curiosity and a lot of faith, believing that the Holy Spirit will see us through

and guide us to another day. Yes, we must be reasonable, we must be vigilant, but we don't need to allow the unknown to consume us.

Pilgrim Faith has been on an intentional journey to redefine its purpose, its mission, and its future. The Council and leaders throughout the congregation have been creating space for this kind of discussion to take place. We've had five important conversations where a team of people listened to your responses to discern a good way forward. The team leading the discussion has completed their work and have created four possible scenarios for our future church. These four options will be available in the New Year and all of us will have an opportunity to review the steps taken, ask any questions or raise any concerns that may be on your heart, and then we'll have to make a choice, choosing the path forward that feels reasonable and responsible. Yes, the New Year brings with it much anticipation a lot of uncertainty, but with God's help and this community working together, we'll find a way forward that continues the ministry of love and grace that has been a hallmark of this congregation over the years. No matter the choice we make, there will be a journey that will take us to a new place, and it will be okay. The time has come for Pilgrim Faith U.C.C. to take a first step to a new beginning. God is calling us from what we have known to something new and different. None of us are sure what that will be, what it will look like, or how we will do it, but whatever it will be it begins with a single step – one mile at a time. Trusting in the Holy Spirit, we take the first step.

The devastating fires that occurred on August 8, 2023 on the island of Maui (particularly the heavy-hit Lahaina area) have left many people without shelter, food, or any of their belongings. But they feel blessed to have lived through this horrendous experience. It is with the help of the UCC Disaster Ministries that the Hawaiian people are beginning to find a way forward. The Disaster Ministries is there to offer long-term assistance where it is needed most. They partner with dozens of organizations, large and small, for holistic, community-based recovery. According to the Hawai'i Conference UCC, it is expected to be 1.5 - 2 years before rebuilding can begin, and with the damage in Lahaina, they anticipate it will be a 7 to 10 year rebuilding process. To have someone like the four men or Daniel to come into our little community and share with us the knowledge, wisdom, insight and visions would be great. These five people would give clarity towards the next steps of Pilgrim Faith. Our dreams (if you believe the history behind dreams and dreaming) is a guideline towards the steps God places before us. In other words, our dreams are the GPS of God's plan.

Before teaching, I would not dream (not ones that would be memorable anyway) until Sunday. The community of Pilgrim Faith would awaken the inner part of my brain and allow me to see more than I could before being awake.

This awakening allows me to challenge what others would say, discuss and complain about. Grounding is fading shadows of what God placed before me, I found myself looking at what is God's calling for Pilgrim Faith. Is it a smaller location? Is it renting out locations to keep the sanctuary open? Is it something totally different that no one has dreamt of yet?

One thing that keeps me to Pilgrim Faith is the concept of the congregation having a say in the running, future, administration and events that happen here. Coming from a Catholic background, assisting to set up a Lutheran Church and taking part in a non-denominational service at college - all did not have the say a congregational church has.The only thing was to remove myself from that environment.

We have seen this happen with the changes that Pilgrim Faith has gone through. Instead of the times of ancient times where people would stand and fight, we have become broken and it is easier to walk away than get involved with anything that would take up the time of God and community. But God does not want that. That is not a way of finding God's calling.

I have been thinking about the idea of community, God and spending time in quiet, reflective prayer; I believe that this is needed for everyone regardless if you believe you can do this or not. If God is calling you to do anything, the only way to find out is by spending time with God.

Next year is a changing year. We have had a conversation about the church; we have paid for professionals to find out if building housing for the seniors would be the answer and we have had smaller companies come in to look at the building. While there are millions of ideas on the plate, we need more than ever to talk with God and ask for guidance.

Regardless of the end results, God's plan will come through. We will change, grow and come to know God closer. This is not only a small community, it is a larger community that calls Jesus our Lord and walks as closely as we can with Him.

This next year, I pray that you find the voice of God and find peace in this world. "And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus" Philippians 4:7
