More Truth and Light

"When the bow is in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on this earth." Genesis 9:16

It has been several years since Pilgrim Faith United Church of Christ has installed a pastor. On Sunday, November 6th, Pilgrim Faith U.C.C., the pastor, and the Chicago Metropolitan Association of the Illinois Conference will Covenant together to recognize the beginning of a pastoral relationship that reaffirms call, mission, ministry, and partnership with one another. This beginning, like so many beginnings in our biblical scriptures begins with a Covenant between one another and especially with God.

Within the Congregational tradition of the United Church of Christ, the notion of Covenant is an important part of our history, and our life together. Within the tradition of the Christian faith, entering any Covenant is always voluntary. We choose to be in community with one another, and we agree to keep one another accountable to God's Covenant and the expectations of the community.

What is Covenant? Sherman, Covenant, Community, and the Spirit defines Covenant this way: "A covenant is an agreement of mutual obligation, regardless of how asymmetrical: one party promises to do these things, the other party those things. ... Whatever promises and obligations are involved, each party is understood as being accountable in acting to uphold his or her side of the covenant. Each party is an 'agent,' that is, one who has the ability and the responsibility to act." (Sherman, Covenant, Community, and the Spirit, 57) The Service of Installation of a pastor within the United Church of Christ is a Covenant between the pastor, the congregation, and the Association, and that is what we will be doing and reaffirming at our service in November.

During the service the terms of the Covenant are publicly proclaimed by the pastor and supported by the congregation and the Association. The terms are as follows: "I am willing, and I promise to serve this church faithfully, preaching and teaching the word of God, administering the sacraments, and fulfilling the pastoral office according to the faith and order of the United Church of Christ." (The Service of Installation, UCC Book of Worship, page 418). In the context of the Installation Service, the congregation and the Association will covenant to support the pastor, holding the pastor accountable to the promises made. Likewise, the pastor is called upon to affirm and hold accountable the terms and expectations of the members who have voluntarily joined this community of faith, and have willingly agreed to participate in the mission and ministry of Pilgrim Faith U.C.C.

Indeed, this is a significant day and one that calls upon us to reflect on our commitment to one another, but more importantly, our commitment to God, God's Church, and God's mission in the world. In addition, the Service of Installation calls upon each person to reflect on your own gifts, passions, and commitment to your calling as a disciple of Jesus Christ. Yes, you are installing a pastor, but any Rite or Sacrament of the Church is also an invitation to rekindle your spirit and to re-engage in the work of building up God's Realm. Yes, it's great to install a pastor, but its even better when each members sees himself or herself as ministers too and those called to build up God's Realm on earth as it is in heaven. Yes, it will be a great day! And, even so, there will be more 'truth and light' to break forth from God's heavenly Word. Come and be a part of this extraordinary day and reaffirm your own calling in the Word of God, the liturgy of the Church, and the promises of the day.

According to Dr. Myers: "So why is Messy
Church messy? And why do we keep having
to convince people the Messy is worth the effort?

Have you ever watched a child creating something? Handed them a blank piece of paper and a pencil and watched the creative process flow? It's something special to behold. Blank paper soon becomes a masterpiece of art or a story comes to life. Most children don't hold back while they are creating something new. They aren't afraid to make a mistake. They aren't worried about what color clashes with another color or about staying in the lines. Their stories can often lean into the fantastical rather than the real world. SHREDDING EVENT



As part of the temporary approval of the new Constitution, a Review Committee was established to receive comments and suggestions for changes throughout the year. The Committee consisted of Peggy and Chuck Martin, Chris Raap and Roger Dykstra (appointed by the Church Council.) With the departure of the Martins, two more volunteers have stepped forward to help with the revisions. They are: Diane Millar and Tom Aitken – both members of the Constitution Committee at one time or another. We will be meeting most Thursdays at 7 p.m. at the Church. Please join us if you would like to share your thoughts and ideas. 
For those of you still wondering why we needed a new Constitution: the old Constitution was written in 1957 and amended in 1996 for a Church of several hundred members. Based on our recent review, it was detailed, complex and full of Committees and Boards, etc. With specified Board / Committee membership numbers, the requirements of the old Constitution were much more than we could possibly hope to fulfill today. The new Constitution Committee spent a lot of time (over nearly two years) assessing the needs of our current and yes, smaller church. They deserve our Thanks for a job well done.

So, let's review what we think are the strengths of the new Constitution. First it eliminates the duality of responsibility and authority between the Church Council and the Board of Trustees. As required by Illinois law, the Church Council now also functions as the Board of Trustees. (From all accounts this seems to be working well.) The second strength is that Ministries (and Committees) are now completely voluntary: no appointment or approval necessary. So, if you're interested in any particular group or have a good idea you want to develop – just join in.

Time is short. So, if you walk up to one of us after Church on Sunday, we will be happy to listen, but please be specific with your suggested changes: write it out or <u>put it in an email</u>. The Committee intends to publish our recommendations as soon as possible for review by all the members. We will probably need some Q&A sessions in early January. Thank for your interest and help.
