More Truth and Light

"Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob; that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths."

Isaiah 2:3

As warm summer days give way to a season of learning and growing and our children, our youth, and young adults return to school, I'm thinking about the Christian faith and the formation of our own children, youth, young adults, and adults into a faithful life of Christian discipleship. As I think of faith formation and teaching the way of Christ, I'm remembering a conversation I had with a member of the first church that called me as their pastor. It was a small, rural congregation in western Pennsylvania. The membership at the time was right around 200 with an average attendance of 50-60 people. We didn't have many children, but we had some. There was no youth program when I started my tenure with the congregation. Within the congregation was an older member and in many ways a mentor to me. I appreciated his openness, his commitment to the United Church of Christ, and his grounded-ness in rural America. While I was there, we got to talking about youth ministry and Christian formation and he said to me, "In this town, there is really very little that will keep our children in the community. I think as a small, rural Christian congregation, perhaps the best we can offer our children is to teach a faith that will enable them to make good choices when they are no longer within the safety and security of the familiar." It has been this conversation that has guided and shaped my own ministry over the years. Am I teaching a faith that will enable the members to make good choices when they are no longer within the safety and

security of the familiar? If not, what do I need to do differently?

The prophet Isaiah shares a similar sentiment, '... Let us go up to the mountain, to the house of the Lord that we may learn the ways of God and walk in such a path...' As I reflect upon my year with Pilgrim Faith UCC, this sentiment is why I organized a ministry for our youth. It is my commitment to faith formation that I feel it is important for the pastor to be a part of the teaching ministry of the church in whatever form it takes. Whether retreating or preaching, planning, or imagining, I will always advocate for an educational component in all we do together as a community of faith. Our ministry is not about quantity in the form of people, programs, and money, but its about preparing faithful people to make good choices when we are no longer in the safety and security of the familiar. It is about 'teaching the ways of God, so that we know the path that is good, faithful, and true.' This is, I believe, what makes for a faithful and thriving congregation. Teaching a faith that matters.

At this time of year, no matter our age or accumulated wisdom, it is appropriate to ask ourselves, 'how is my faith today?' 'Am I satisfied with where I am, or am I ready to learn even more?' We might ask ourselves, what can I do, or offer, that would help us to grow and encourage others to see that the joy of learning and teaching is an important part of our walk of faith. Maybe this is the season to do more.




COME AND HELP US PLAN TRUNK OR TREAT THIS

BOOK AND BIBLE STUDY PLANNED FOR THE FALL!



In his book, Evil Geniuses: The Unmaking of America: A Recent History, the author Kurt Andersen identifies eight "truth claims" made by the political right that champion aggressive self-sufficiency and selfsecurity at the expense of the community. In his book, "Ancient Ech-

oes", Dr. Walter Brueggemann responds from a biblical perspective to the eight 'claims' of the political right. He asserts that the echoes of biblical faith reveal that right-wing 'truth claims' contradict our scripture. Pastor Dan will begin our five-week, in person discussion using Brueggemann's book, Ancient Echoes, on Sunday October 15th from 8 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. in the lounge. In preparing for the class, you may want to read both books. Andersen's book will give you the context in which Dr. Brueggemann responds. My primary focus will be on the material in his book, Ancient Echoes. We'll look at the bible stories and verses that support Brueggemann's argument and reflect on his thoughts as presented in the book. Please join us for our discussion.

Music at Pilgrim Faith




Have you ever wanted to perform in a music group? Now is your chance! Pilgrim Faith UCC is looking for members to join their choir and bell choir.
