One of the early church pastors in the tradition of the Congregational church, John Robinson, spoke words of encouragement to his departing congregation who were seeking more truth and light in the new world. John Robinson understood that the voyage being undertaken by his small congregation required not only fortitude in human endeavor but also an attitude of pilgrim spirit on their journey for more light and truth in this new world that would one day become our home. Such is our time at Pilgrim Faith U.C.C. The Holy Spirit is guiding us to more light and new truth, and as Robinson said to his congregation long ago, "I am verily persuaded that the Lord hath more light and truth yet to break forth out of His [sic] Holy Word."

Last month I shared with you the principles and guidelines of conversations being planned to use as a format we call World Café. World Café is an opportunity for all voices to be heard on important issues facing Pilgrim Faith UCC at this time. More importantly, we believe that 'more truth and light' will come from the collective wisdom of the people who have found strength, comfort, nurture, and support at Pilgrim Faith UCC.

I posted above a quote from the psychologists and scholars, Humberto Maturana and Francisco Varela who published an article entitled, *"The Tree of Knowledge."* In their work they pointed out that there are no certainties in this world and that the best way forward in this world is to be active and involved participants in the world that is ours to experience and create. The quote makes the point that the only world that is real is the one we create for ourselves. This puts us firmly in a position to imagine and create our destiny, our future life together. This is what World Café will be doing and everyone who has experienced or called Pilgrim Faith U.C.C. their spiritual home, believes in its future in whatever new form it takes, and would like to participate in our future life together are invited to join us for five conversations that matter. 

CLIMATE HOPE CARDS- A POST CARD CAMPAIGN

The United Church of Christ Climate Hope Cards campaign is an ambitious and exciting project rooted in the UCC's decades long work for climate and environmental justice. In this critical moment, every person and organization has a choice to make. Should we stay silent as the most vulnerable people living today face real and worsening climate and environmental justice crises? Should we stand by while a livable future hangs in the balance for our children and children's children? Or



should we look to the prophetic examples fighting for justice? Already, the UCC passed General Synod resolutions about climate change, pollution, and caring for Creation. In that spirit, we are glad you are joining us in this latest push for greater justice in our world!

The climate and environmental crises are massive and action on every level is required to turn things around. That's why we are calling on individuals, congregations, cities and towns, states, and especially the federal government to finally act as if we are in a crisis. We need strong action from the EPA and the White House. President Biden and his administration need to know that climate justice is a priority-that's where we come in! UCC children and youth from across the country have already sent in artwork expressing their feelings about environmental justice, the climate crisis, and protecting the Earth. Winning artwork has been printed on Climate Hope Card postcards. Now it's up to us to collect thousands of postcards for delivery to the EPA and the White House!

UCC congregations will collect thousands of postcards (printed with the winning art) to urge the Environmental Protection Agency to update Federal pollution rules. These strengthened protections would save thousands of lives, address societal inequalities, and put the United States on a path to meet its climate goals.

We find ourselves in the midst of ongoing climate and environmental justice crises. The future sometimes seems uncertain and even frightening. Yet as people of faith, we are called to heed prophetic voices and fight for a livable planet.

It is in action that hope is found. As the Israelites confronted the challenges of their time, the prophet Jeremiah passed along God's message: Your labor is not in vain. There is hope for your future (Jeremiah 31:17).

What does this mean for Pilgrim Faith?

The Ministry team of Spiritual Formation and Mission and ANYONE who wants to help on this important mission, will be asking for your help! It is simple- just fill out a Climate Hope Postcard with your information and give it back to us! Then, at the end of the summer all the postcards will be delivered to the Environmental Protection Agency and the White House. Your information will only be used to allow you to connect directly with the EPA to make a personal plea for improved rules that govern our environment. The need is HUGE and we can help by letting our government know how many people really care to make a difference!
